Sugar Crystals Activity

Hey there, future scientists! Get ready to embark on a sugary adventure as we dive into the world of crystal making.

You will need:

- A cup
- A jug
- Sugar
- Spoon
- A jar
- A plate
- A screwer
- A clothes peg

Method:

- 1. First things first, you need some water, sugar, and a trusty jar.

- 8. Be patient, young scientists! After 2-3 days, take a peek at your skewer. It should be all dressed up in sugar crystals, like a sparkly outfit.
- 9. Here's the science scoop: hot water can hold more sugar than cold water. But when it cools down, the sugar decides to throw a party and forms crystals on the skewer. You can even eat them like lollipops if you're feeling adventurous!
- 10. Want more colourful fun? Try adding a few drops of food dye to the water along with the sugar next time. Watch as your crystals turn into a rainbow of sugary goodness!









Make a glowing galaxy sensory bottle

Let's create a magical glowing galaxy in a bottle!

You will need:

- Sturdy plastic bottle
- Almost full bottle of hair gel
- A squirt of glitter glue
- A squirt of glow-in-the-dark paint
- Super glue
- Glow-in-the-dark mini stars

Method:

- 1. Squeeze the glitter glue into the bottom of the bottle.
- 2. Add a little bit of glow-in-the-dark paint, just a good squirt. The glitter glue will make it sparkle, and the paint will add a hint of glow.
- 3. Fill the bottle almost to the top with hair gel. The gel makes it so stars don't fall right away, and the bubbles inside simulate stars in the galaxy.
- 4. Drop your glow-in-the-dark stars into the bottle. Tip: If your gel is too thick, add a couple of tablespoons of water to help the stars move.
- 5. Very important! Once it looks just right, use super glue to seal the lid tightly.

Now you have your very own glowing galaxy in a bottle! Enjoy the magic of the stars anytime you want.











Black Sparkle Space Modelling Dough

This Black Sparkle Space Modelling Dough Recipe sounds like a fun and creative project!

You will need:

- 250 g of plain flour
- 2 tbsp. vegetable oil
- 63 g salt
- 2 tbsp. cream of tartar
- 400ml boiling water
- Black food colouring (or 1 tbsp. black powder paint for older children)
- Few drops glycerine
- Edible gold or silver glitter (used for cake decorating)



Method:

- 1. In a large mixing bowl, combine the plain flour, salt, and cream of tartar. Mix these dry ingredients together.
- 2. In a separate container, add black food colouring to the boiling water. The amount of food colouring you use will depend on how intense you want the black colour to be. Mix until you achieve the desired colour.
- 3. Carefully pour the coloured boiling water into the dry ingredients mixture. Stir as you pour to combine everything.
- 4. Add a few drops of glycerine to the mixture. Glycerine helps make the dough smoother and more elastic.
- 5. Allow the mixture to cool down for a bit. You want to avoid handling hot dough.

- 7. Knead in the edible gold or silver glitter. You can add as much glitter as you like to achieve the desired sparkle effect.

- 8. Now, go and have some glittery, colourful fun with your magical paint!











Sun catcher crafting

Get ready for a fun crafting adventure! In this project, we'll turn ordinary materials into a sparkling star decoration that will add a burst of colour to any room. Let's begin!

You will need:

- Clear contact paper (like sticky plastic)
- · Colourful tissue paper, cut into small squares
- Scissors
- String (to hang your decoration)

Method:

- 5. Stick the paper star template to the contact paper star so the sticky side faces up.
- 6. Take the colourful tissue paper squares and start sticking them onto the sticky part of the contact paper until the whole star is covered with the tissue paper.
- 7. Finally, use a hole punch to make a small hole at the top of the star and thread the string.
- 8. . Your star decoration is ready to hang up and brighten your room!
- 9. Have fun creating your colourful star decoration!

Make Your Own Glitter!

Create eco-friendly glitter at home using simple ingredients

You will need:

- Epsom salt (or you can use sea salt or sugar)
- Food colouring

Method:

- 1. Get a bowl or a food bag.
- 2. Put some Epsom salt into the bowl or bag.
- 3. Add a few drops of food colouring.
- 4. Mix it all up really well (you can squish it in the bag if you want).
- 5. Spread out your sparkly stuff and let it dry.
- 6. When it's dry, you can use your glitter!

Notes:

- 1. Sea salt makes colours less bright.
- 2. Sugar can stick together more, but it is safe to eat and great for glittery cupcakes!
- 3. Epsom salt is for bath salts, so at home you can add a few drops of nice-smelling essential oil to your homemade glitter and make relaxing bath salts.
- 4. Remember, your DIY glitter may not be as shiny as the store-bought kind, but it's better for the environment, can be used for lots of things, and you'll be proud of making it yourself (plus, it's not as messy as plastic glitter!).
